Australian Passports – Adult Applicants

This information sheet should be read in conjunction with the guidance notes available at www.passports.gov.au.

Applications or renewals of an Australian passport will be accepted by appointment only, Monday to Friday between 8:30am and 12:00pm. All passport applications must be lodged in person.

Your new passport will take **3 weeks** to process. If you need to travel while your new document is being processed, please advise staff at the interview. For this option you will need to keep your current passport and present it to us for cancellation when you collect your new passport. If you choose to have your current passport cancelled at the interview, your new passport can be mailed to you in Thailand or collected in person from the Consular Services Section at the Embassy.

Passport Renewal (PC7)

To replace an existing Australian adult passport

Before your passport interview appointment:

- Please register and log-on via www.passports.gov.au to complete the **Renewal** form.

Please bring to your passport interview appointment:

- Completed Renewal form;
- Current Australian passport; and
- Three passport photos - <https://www.passports.gov.au/Web/Requirements/Photos.aspx>.

Full Application - Overseas Passport Application (PC8) First Australian Passport or to replace a lost or stolen Passport

Before your passport interview appointment:

- Please register and log-on via www.passports.gov.au to complete the Application Form.

Please bring the following **original documents** to the passport interview appointment:

- Completed Application Form including a properly completed Guarantor section (see attached list of guarantor categories);
- Most recent Australian passport (if applicable);
- If born in Australia - original Australian birth certificate;
- If born in Australia on or after 20/08/1986 - Original Australian birth certificate plus evidence to prove your Australian citizenship or to prove that one of your parents was an Australian citizen at the time of your birth

- If born overseas – original birth certificate plus original translation stamped by the translation office plus original Australian Citizenship certificate;
- Three supporting identity documents (ID) in your full name. For example, an Australian or foreign driving licence, foreign passport, Australian Proof of Age card, Medicare card, debit/credit card, health care card. *At least one of these must show your photo and residential address*;
- **Three passport photos** (photo requirements are available at <https://www.passports.gov.au/Web/Requirements/Photos.aspx>)
- If you have changed your name, evidence of your change of name (guidelines are available at <https://www.passports.gov.au/Web/NameChange.aspx>)
- If your Australian passport has been lost or stolen you must present a Thai police report.

If you are unable to complete or print an application online please contact the Consular Services Section.

Passport pages full?

We can offer a **replacement passport** if your passport **still has at least two years validity remaining**. The replacement passport will have the same expiry date as the original passport. *(Note: this option replaces the former Frequent Traveller 64 page passports)*

- Please register and log-on via www.passports.gov.au to complete the Renewal Form

Please bring to your passport interview appointment:

- Completed Renewal form;
- Current Australian passport; and
- **Three passport photos** (photo requirements are available at <https://www.passports.gov.au/Web/Requirements/Photos.aspx>);

Fees

Adults are issued with a (34 page) 10 year validity passport.

- The fee for this passport is AUD282 plus overseas surcharge AUD105 - total AUD387.

Where visa pages are full, adults may choose a 34 page replacement passport which will have the same expiry date as their existing passport.

- The fee for this passport is: AUD178 (no overseas surcharge).

Adults aged 75 years and older may request a 5 year validity passport.

- The fee for this passport is AUD142 plus overseas surcharge AUD105 - total AUD247.

Fees are payable in **Thai Baht** by **CREDIT or DEBIT CARD** and are linked to the AUD/THB exchange rate and re-aligned monthly. For current THB fee information please refer to our website; https://thailand.embassy.gov.au/bkok/Australian_Passports_Page.html

Passport photos

Your photo is critical to the usability and security of your passport. The facial recognition technology used in conjunction with Australian passports makes border processing more efficient and reduces the potential for identity fraud. If your photo does not meet the Australian Passport Office standards, your passport may not work at automated borders.

We appreciate that obtaining a photo in Thailand that meets the photo requirements can be challenging. **Master Photo Sathorn** are familiar with Australian passport photo requirements though you are welcome to select another photo outlet who is able to meet the Australian passport photo requirements.

Please avoid photos with a matte finish. Gloss photos provide a higher quality image.

The applicant's identity must be clearly established. A Guarantor may be either:

- the holder of a current Australian passport with at least two years validity;
or
- the local equivalent of the occupational categories listed below.
